Editorial by Franklin Local Board

We want to thank everyone who took the opportunity to make a submission on Auckland Council's Long-term Plan, and those who delved deeper into Franklin Local Board's plans.

With a proposal for a targeted rate to help fund safety improvements on our paths and walkways, and to add to the wider network across the area, we expected a good response, and we weren't disappointed.

Franklin's response was stronger than in other areas, probably because of the rate question.

Council staff and board members will carefully analyse the responses, which ranged from a yes or no, to detailed and well-thought-out arguments both for and against.

What we can say is that nothing has been decided and the information gathered will help us reach a decision.

It isn't just a case of counting the submissions and saying it's 100 for and 99 against so we can go ahead.

Board members are keenly aware they represent everyone across the three subdivisions, all of which would benefit from the rate, and which could advocate to have things added that the rate could fund. That means that while those who submitted have given us plenty to think about, we must do our best to represent the people who didn't make a submission, for whatever reason, because they are just as much a part of the community.

We'll consider the responses and factor in things like, is it fair at a time of economic stress for many to be adding an extra cost on our people?

You could build an argument that younger working people might be much better placed to cope with the rate than older people whose incomes are restricted.

Auckland Council has told us it does not have the funding to continue work that began as a result of previous consultations where people told us they would like to see more pathways, especially in areas with high numbers of children walking near roads that have the potential to add to the risks they take just getting to and from school.

There are always those who take a narrow view of our spending – that it should be restricted to must haves like water and sewers, and those who take a wider view, that it's our role to provide other amenities - the nice to haves - that make communities better places. Both views are compelling and need to be given

equal weight.

If the decision is to recommend a targeted rate, that's a cost that is loaded on to all our ratepayers, and those who might choose to come to make our area their home in future, because the responsibility for the rate would transfer to any new homeowner.

Then there is the old bogey that ratepayers pay, but non-ratepayers also benefit. That's true of libraries, sports parks, swimming pools, playgrounds and many other board and councilfunded amenities.

What we can guarantee, is that all members are aware of the current financial stresses many face, and no decision will be made lightly, or without debate and consideration of the information and advice available to us.



Sad season for dotterels

Shoreline nesting birds have had an unsuccessful nesting season.

For the first time, oystercatchers were seen sitting on a nest at Te Puru, but unfortunately the chicks did not survive.

At Omana, a pair of dotterels hatched three chicks which disappeared one-by-one

It is possible the chicks were killed by rats or cats.

The Omana dotterels then had a second attempt at nesting, but on the day the eggs were due to hatch they disappeared. It is suspected that a high tide on the day of hatching may have pushed other birds into the nesting area, and that they ate the chicks.

Road safety initiative lights up Beachlands School assembly

There were 650 big smiles on the faces of Beachlands School students recently, when local residents Martin and Tania MacKenzie visited the school to present each child with an LED bike light to help keep them safe on the roads.

The *PC Times* wrote about Martin in September 2023, when he launched an initiative 'Love enough to care' aimed at keeping cyclists seen by giving away heart-shaped LED bike lights.

Martin's desire to help other people stems from a tragedy a decade ago, when his 23-year-old son died in a crash with a drunk driver on Chapel Road.

Shortly afterwards Martin began volunteering for Victim Support, accompanying police when they visited families of people who had died unexpectedly.

Helping others has become something of a passion, and Martin was delighted to get support recently from Barfoot & Thompson Beachlands, who have sponsored bike lights for all Beachlands School students and staff as well.

Speaking to the Beachlands School students, Martin said: "Every one of you is precious to someone - either your mum and dad, brother and sister or grandparents. Road safety is very important."

Barfoot & Thompson Beachlands branch manager Daniel Wei says there were "so many good reasons" to be part of the initiative.

"I'm a young dad, I've got three little ones. The two older ones are 6 and 4 years old. We've recently been enjoying riding our bikes locally. I've got a great deal of respect for Martin and Tania and when we got the opportunity to join together to do this, I was really proud to be involved."

Martin is also offering the bike lights to anyone who wants them. Most people offer to pay the \$6 wholesale cost for them, but he is happy to give them away to anyone who can't afford to buy one. Gloriavale survivor tells her story in new television documentary

degree in Occupational Therapy.

Eight years on from leaving Gloriavale, Theophila now hopes that sharing her story will help raise awareness and bring an end to the cult.

The response to the docu-series has been very positive, she says. "I think even the people who have left Gloriavale have said the doco is the most accurate, that the story is being told right for the first time."

"People are asking what they can do to help, and they are sort of in shock that it's in India as well. Doing the doco, that was my big reason, to raise awareness of that."

Gloriavale established a community in southern India in about 2009. Theophila's sister, Precious, is one of six young women from Gloriavale who now live in the Indian chapter, without access to their passports. Precious entered an arranged marriage and now has six children, who have no birth certificates and are therefore unable to travel.

In *Escaping Utopia*, Theophila travels to India to assess her sister's welfare. She found her sister living in third world conditions, sharing a small mouldy room with no door on the toilet. Confronting the Indian community's leader on camera, Theophila was all but told that the women who live there are subjected to sexual abuse. "What is rape? ... Indian men are

very forceful around women," the leader says in the documentary.

While in India, Theophila also met her six nieces and nephews. In one scene of the documentary, she can be seen carrying her young niece who hugs Theophila tightly around her neck.

"My niece hugged me for hours. Mum said she doesn't normamlly hug anyone, but she just hugged me for hours and wouldn't let me go."

Since the visit Theophila has only managed to speak to her sister once.

"It's really hard seeing her in that situation. She's sort of going through what my mum lived through, it's a repeat of being in an abusive environment. She can see no future for herself or her kids."

Following Theophila's visit, human rights lawyer Deborah Manning has been in touch with Police.

"She's had really good feedback from the police, and they have got someone on the case now. They are taking it seriously," says Theophila.

"Now it's just keeping up that awareness, and hopefully getting other locals to keep pushing it with their local MP. If locals want to help, just keep ringing your local MP's [Judith Collins] office and asking what they are going to do."

In the meantime, Theophila continues her mission to raise awareness of what is happening at Gloriavale. She has just finished documenting her story in a book which she hopes will be in stores by the end of the year.

"Writing the book has helped me but it has also really brought to reality what I lived through and what I thought was normal, that was not. I guess you keep finding out more things, sadly. But the more we speak about it, the more awareness there is."

Theophila says she is no longer religious. "I do believe in a higher power, but I'm not religious. I think you can find meaning in other places than church."

One thing she would like to ask, is that people be kind if they see people from Gloriavale.

"My mum's just had spinal surgery, and I've been out with other family members who turned up to try and help my mum. Quite a few locals were filming them, and that sort of response... I think, just be kind. They're human."

She finds it hard to understand how Gloriavale has been allowed to continue, given the testimonies of people who have left the sect, and convictions of sexual abuse by Gloriavale's male leaders. Theophila is one of 10 complainants due to give evidence in the Greymouth District Court later this year in the case of Gloriavale leader Howard Temple, who is accused of 24 charges of indecent assault involving complainants aged between 9

and 20 at the time of the alleged offending.

Previous cases lead to the jailing of founder Hopeful Christian on sexual abuse charges in 1995.

"The sad thing is that people shouldn't have to keep coming forward," says Theophila. "There's enough [evidence] there, why should kids keep being damaged while people just keep hoping it will be shut down? Suicide and mental health is a huge problem with young people who are in cults. How many more people have to commit suicide for the government to do something?"


Theophila's relationship with her mother (who still lives in Glorivale) has improved in recent years, but Theophila was worried about her mother's reaction to *Escaping Utopia*.

"I was really scared of what her response to the documentary was going to be. But she's seen it and thinks that it's all true."

While Theophila's mother has had something of a mindshift about what is going on at Gloriavale, she has about 40 nieces and nephews who still live at the Gloriavale compound which makes it difficult for her to leave.

Theophila sums up Gloriavale as a cult. "A very fear based environment, psychologically. Fear and control," she says. "You can see the trauma in the kids' eyes.

"It just needs to be shut down."


Lest We Forget: anzac Services

Equine therapy course proves a hit with local neurodiverse youth

Equine therapy sessions have proved a winner with three local children.

Whitford resident Michelle Godsiff and business partner Lissa Gilliver offered ten weeks of horse therapy for the children at Whispering Hope, based in Clifton Road.

Fourteen-year-old Olivia*, who has an anxiety disorder, undertook equine therapy in the hope she would be able to find some sense of peace in it.

"I'm not someone who has spent an enormous time around horses but I have always found them to be amazing animals. Even just the aspect of getting to be around them really appealed to me so when mum told me that we were going to go take a look at it and see what it was all about, I was quite interested," says Olivia.

"I also was hoping to find some benefit throughout the whole experience, that maybe it would have a positive impact on my life in some way. I've tried many things over the span of my life and it really is hard to find something that really makes a difference, so I was willing to give it a try."

Despite having doubts about equine therapy at the start, Olivia says she found the experience of laying down on the ground with therapy horse Cracker Jack incredible.

"I actually felt something rare. I wasn't fidgety or wanting to just get up and do the next thing even though I was enjoying it. I felt really at peace. I think part of it was that it was all just so surreal. Horses are massive and I was laying with one. I felt like I was there for maybe 20 minutes at the most but I ended up laying there for an hour."

Olivia says she also enjoyed the attention the horses gave her. "When they take an interest in me of their own accord it makes me feel super special. The connections we built with the horses felt great. It left me feeling energised and relaxed at the same time for a while after. Such huge powerful creatures being so gentle is part of that."

Humans and horses share more in common that people might think, says Olivia. "The behaviour and emotions I saw in the horses were often ones that I am familiar with."

While Olivia says the programme has not resulted in dramatic changes to her everyday life, it was worth doing.

"I would definitely say that it was great for me. It gave me a place to escape to where I could be calm. It felt so separate to everything else and when I was there it felt as though I was in a completely different realm where only the farm existed, there was nothing else outside of that. None of my problems felt so in my face when I was there and being with the horses was beautiful. It may not have healed me or fixed all my problems but it definitely left an imprint on me."

Programme facilitator Lissa says that a lot of the initial part of the programme involves learning how to slow down.

"A big part of this is slowing people down enough to learn how to just be in the moment a little bit more." Each of the ten sessions focuses on an important aspect such as safety around horses, kindness/friendliness, respect, helpfulness, trust and connection. Participants spend time grooming, interacting with and occasionally riding the horses, and are taught to notice the horse's body language as a way of communication.

For six-year-old Rose*, who has attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), the horses have offered an opportunity to learn how to slow down and just be in the moment. Rose's father Chris* says he has found the programme really good.

"It's really clear that when she's here she behaves differently than she does at home. She seems to be able to focus, maybe not all the time but she is attentive. She has a fascination with the world and she wants to learn but at home she doesn't necessarily listen and take it all in. Whereas here, it might be something about the environment, because animals and horses are a special interest for her, she can focus."

"On the back of the horse she looked happy and content, which is not something she does often."

Rose has commented that she loves the sound of horse's feet, and that she found it relaxing.

"That's a pretty big thing because she doesn't usually say things like that," says Chris.

While Chris says he hasn't seen any changes in Rose's behaviour at home, he is realistic that a ten-week course is not going to instantly change hard-wired neurodivergence.

"I'm sure she's learned stuff here that will resonate with her at some point in her life, like building positive relationships with the horses and people and having positive memories that will stick with her."

Chris says the course has opened his eyes to being more tolerant, and has even prompted him to seek answers about his own behaviour which he suspects is also due to undiagnosed ADHD.

Olivia says she would recommend the programme to others.

Make your own fresh and flavourlicious feijoa fizz!

How good is feijoa season? If you're lucky enough to have a tree (or a neighbour with a tree!) you'll now be in the midst of a feijoa glut. But what to do with all those leftover feijoa skins? Here's a simple recipe to turn them into a delicious fizzy drink!

Ingredients

Feijoa skins - enough to fill a 1-litre jar 2T white sugar 1T brown sugar Water

Method

- 1. Loosely fill a one-litre jar with feijoa skins. Add the white sugar and cover with water. Close the lid securely.
- 2. Leave the jar in the sun or hot water cupboard for at least two days. The liquid should turn slightly fizzy.
- 3. Strain the liquid, discard the skins, and pour into a 750ml glass bottle. Add the brown sugar and top with water. Leave in the sun for 24 hours.
- 4. Chill for a few hours in the fridge, then enjoy!






