Maraetai sailors win world championship

13-year-old Maraetai sailors Callum Hyde and Callum Noyer sailed their way to a World junior title at the 2023 RS Feva World Championships held in Follonica, Italy last month.

A perfect mix of blustery wind to light and shifty conditions tested the skill and tactics of the 209-boat fleet over the five day regatta.

Sailing in a heat wave where temperatures climbed up to 40 degrees Celsius on some days had its challenges, but Callum and Callum managed to stay well hydrated. Two first places in their qualifying races on days one and two put them into the lead, qualifying them to race against 69 other boats in the Gold fleet. Over the final 3 days of the regatta the boys fought hard for another first place, which they say was one of the highlights of the regatta.

During the final days of the regatta the boys kept their cool under a range of conditions to finish 347 points ahead of their nearest competitors, earning them the junior world title.

Their outstanding performance saw them place 4th overall in all categories including the Open (over-18) division.

Callum Noyer says it was an amazing experience to sail against so many other competitors from around the world. Callum Hyde says: "We worked hard to get good clean starts to help us get off the line with speed, which at times was hard given the amount of boats on the line."

The boys say they would like to thank everyone for their support which allowed them to have an "amazing" experience sailing against the top RS Feva sailors from around the world. They boys now have friends from the UK, Germany, and Switzerland who they hope to see again at next year's world champs if they are able to go.

It is the second year in a row that Maraetai sailors have claimed victory at the event. Last year then-13-year-old Maraetai locals Kate Rasmussen and Madi Russell won the 2022RS Feva World Champs women's title and finished 8th overall.

Guest editorial by Friends of Te Wairoa chair Glenn Richards

Friends of Te Wairoa continue to work as a community group to improve the health and life force of the Wairoa River, the second largest river in Auckland which runs from Paparimu and Ararimu, through the Hūnua Falls and out to sea via Clevedon. Some of its tributaries contribute to the dams in the Hūnua Ranges and supply Auckland City with two thirds of their drinking water. The Wairoa River is of special significance to Ngāi Tai ki Tāmaki. It's a very important river and it needs the community that live in its catchment to respect and care for it.

Part of what we do is educating, enabling and activating landowners in the catchment to do their bit. So far this year, we've held a riparian planting workshop, a seed collection and sowing workshop, and numerous predator control days. In September we have an almost fully booked workshop on Understanding Soils, and our AGM will feature guest speaker James Talbot (20 September, 6pm in the Hūnua Hall). James is from Watercare and will speak about the work being done in the Hūnua Ranges to fell pine plantations and replant with natives, and the benefits of doing this.

Our community native plant nursery is pumping, with massive amounts of donated seed being sown for next season during the volunteer days which are held once a month. Seedlings are growing nicely and are available for purchase to anyone within the Wairoa River Catchment.

Our pest management programme continues to grow strongly. We are going to add pest plant management to it over the next year. Our initial experiences seem to indicate that people who are interested in predator control on their properties are usually also interested in dealing with their pest plants. We will be trialling different ways of bringing education and products to the community.

We're progressing work on a willow eradication project too. In the coming weeks we'll have flyers printed and we are making a short video on how to remove willows from your section of the stream or river. Willows are invasive as every broken piece can root again to form a new plant, and they obstruct the flow of the river causing dams and blockages which contribute to flooding damage. We'd love for this project to be a success, but realistically we can only achieve our goals with the full support and contributions from the community.

So, on that note, we give massive thanks to the surrounding communities, within and outside of the Wairoa River catchment, who support the work we do and volunteer or donate to help us work towards achieving our goals.



Hūnua community mourns passing of local character

Messages of love and support flowed from the Hūnua community last weekend, as news of the death of Hūnua General Store owner Raj Charan was shared on social media.

The news was met with sadness by locals, and many shared their memories of the store owner best known for his cheeky sense of humour.

Raj's daughter, Priyanka, summed up what Raj meant to the local community in a Facebook tribute to her father last Sunday: "You were a man of the community and touched many lives."

Raj and Ronita Charan's successful business has been a regular contender at the Indian Newslink Business Awards, where it won the BNZ Excellence in Retail Trade award twice.

The competition judges heaped praise upon the store, saying Raj and Ronita "have brought third generation grocery skills to the small South Auckland settlement of Hūnua and have developed a charming community focused general store.

"They provide everything from flowers and espresso to fuel, and feature local produce. They have become an important gathering point in a community that prides itself on country values. The successful retail offering has resulted in doubling of revenue in three years and further expansion is on the cards."

Raj was an early adopter of the phasing

out of plastic shopping bags, partnering with Hūnua School in a fundraising initiative which saw him selling reusable shopping bags and donating proceeds back to the school PTA.

Theft a 'mare for local business

Last week's theft of a large amount of horse riding gear has devastated an Ardmore business owner.

Tara Sullivan established her successful riding school four years ago, when she was aged just 20. Since then, the Sullivan Stables has provided riding and horse care lessons to many young people in the area.

The theft, which occurred during the early hours of last Thursday 7 September, saw offenders break into the locked premises and take more than \$20,000 worth of horse tack including saddles, bridles, back protectors, helmets, boots and more. Most of the gear is essential to the running of the business.

A newish model dark coloured ute with canopy was spotted at the Papakura Clevedon Road property at around 4.45am.

"Whoever it was knew what they were doing, as they were very specific with what they took," says Tara.

One of the items stolen was a saddle engraved with Tara's name. "It's pretty distinctive, so they'll have trouble selling it," she says.

The offenders also broke into the stable clubhouse and opened all the drawers and cupboards, although nothing was taken.

Tara says the past week has been a stressful time, but that the local equestrian community has stepped up to help.

"At first we didn't know how we were going to be able to operate the business,

but so many people have offered us spare gear to use. It's been a rollercoaster of emotions and it's made us realise that despite the break-in there are so many good people out there willing to help."

While the gear was insured, it will take some time to sort out the claim, says Tara.

Tara is appealing for anyone who might have further information about the burglary to contact Police on 105.

Concerns raised over Plan Change 88

An application to rezone 307 hectares of Beachlands land has Franklin Local Board concerned.

Board chair Angela Fulljames says Beachlands South Ltd Partnership's application - Plan change 88, covers land at Jack Lachlan Drive and Whitford-Maraetai Road, and decision-makers must take the board's views into account.

"We've made submissions and will speak at a hearing. It's a change that would see almost 160 hectares become residential, business, light industry and open space, with another 147 as future urban."

The application was notified in January, with 383 submissions received, the key themes being change of character, visual amenity, transport, water, education, healthcare, infrastructure funding and environmental impacts.

"Beachlands is a township in the same way Pukekohe and Waiuku are in the Local Board Plan," Fulljames

"However, it has no council-managed facilities, kerb and channel and footpath gaps, no secondary school or emergency medical facilities, relies on tank water and has grown in an ad-hoc way.

"We've raised issues around transport, particularly roading, and have noted the proposal does not address the effects on the traffic, intersections and flow through Whitford."

That concern has been echoed by fellow Wairoa subdivision members Malcolm Bell and Amanda Hopkins, Bell calling a bypass essential and

advocating for roundabouts to slow traffic, more footpaths and provision for cyclists.

"It's also a chance for a service hub as part of a multi-user library similar to Takanini, with the old Formosa sport centre perhaps a suitable venue," he

Water is highlighted in the board's concerns, with a request that any development connect to Watercare's

Okaroro Drive wastewater plant, and not develop its own.

"We do note the plan change might provide the scale for Watercare to complete a water and wastewater scheme to benefit the wider area," Fulljames says. "But the application relies on water from bores and increased take from Pine Harbour, already subject to complaints."

With much of the area along the

Waikopua estuary, the board says ecological protection has not been fully addressed. Hopkins says the view of independent ecologists and iwi is needed.

"No one wants increased sedimentation that development might cause, and we'd suggest a greater setback to allow for further protection and coastal erosion," she says.

There are also concerns about visual impacts. Fulljames says the ridgeline would be visible from the Hauraki Gulf, and housing should be set back to reduce that impact, while lighting should be designed to not impact the dark sky or disturb wildlife.

Other infrastructure concerns surround power outages in the area, and walkways and play spaces, but note provision has been made for the Ministry of Education to buy land for a high school.

"A new school isn't a given," Bell says. "The development would make it more likely, but a change of government might alter everything."

Fulliames welcomed the move to set aside land for a light industrial zone but questioned whether it would provide enough jobs for the increased population.

The reporting planner will report on the concerns in the hearing report, and a panel of independent experts will listen to submissions at a hearing in November.

More funds for kerb and channel

Another \$600,000 has been allocated to the pedestrian bridge over the Whangapouri Stream near Jutland Road in Pukekohe's Belmont to keep schoolchildren safe.

Franklin Local Board chair Angela Fulljames says the last board prioritised the bridge because the area was too dangerous for pedestrians moving across a stream that swells during rain events.

"That did mean our Transport Capital Fund was spent, impacting kerb and channel work at Beachlands.

"While we have again allocated funds to the bridge, we have also earmarked significant funds for kerb and channel work at First View and Second View Avenues and Karaka Road. It may be that the amount allocated across the three sites is used differently, depending on the efficiencies involved in undertaking the work."

The board has also called for any Whangapouri culvert upgrade to include a walkway, a move that would take pressure off the board's transport budget.

Local Board Transport Capital Funds allow boards to deliver transport infrastructure projects that are a local priority, but which might not be considered a priority within Auckland Transport's work programme.

Camp Adair's future in doubt

Auckland's wild weather could yet claim YMCA Camp Adair.

Thousands of people have made millions of memories at the outdoor activities campsite over the years, but three 100-year adverse weather events inside just 12 years have flooded the property causing widespread damage to buildings and infrastructure such as in-ground wastewater systems.

YMCA group manager outdoors and fundraising Dave Lockwood told Franklin Local Board's August that might cost, or even if it would be business meeting relocating or building stopbanks to protect the camp, with the costs of such work unknown, appeared to be the only alternatives.

"Relocating might have to be looked "With three floods in 12 years at, but where to, and at what cost? It's not as simple as picking everything up and moving it to a new site, especially when you don't have one."

Board Wairoa subdivision member Malcolm Bell was at Camp Adair for the opening.

"The kids will have no shortage of mud to wallow in, but the effects of the damage are still there. The bridge over the Wairoa River is out of bounds, with the kids set to have to wade through the river to cross to the other side. subject to safety of course."

He said it was amazing how many of the adults at the opening had been to the camp in their own childhoods.

"It's an incredible facility that makes an experience available at an affordable price. Losing it would be devastating. Camp Adair is not just for Franklin, many users come from areas where money is tight, and access to programmes like this relies on groups like the YMCA."

The board has agreed to work with YMCA to resolve the issues the camp



Mushroom Ratatouille - by The Kai Box

INGREDIENTS:

- 3/4 cup bulghur wheat
- 1 TBs olive oil
- ½ onion, finely chopped
- · 3-4 garlic cloves, minced
- 250g button mushrooms, sliced
- 1 yellow capsicum, diced
- 1 red capsicum, diced
- 1 courgette, cubed
- 1 eggplant, cut into small cubes
- 1/2 TBs Italian Herbs
- 1 tin chopped tomatoes
- 1 bay leaf
- salt and ground black pepper to taste
- 1 TBs red-wine vinegar or balsamic vinegar



INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Heat the oil in large deep-sided frying pan, add onions and sauté until translucent. Add garlic and cook for a minute.
- 2. Then add the mushrooms and cook for a few minutes. Add the capsicums, eggplant, courgettes and tomatoes. Add the Italian Herbs, salt and pepper and stir.
- 3. Pop the bay leaf in and partially cover, simmer on low until the vegetables are tender but not mushy, 20-25mins.
- 4. While the ratatouille cooks soak the bulghur wheat in a bowl of 1½ cups of boiled water, no need to cook, just add salt.
- 5. Once the ratatouille is cooked add the red wine vinegar or balsamic vinegar and taste for seasoning.
- 6. Drain any water from bulghur wheat, fluff with a fork and serve topped with the ratatouille.



RMS Niagara - the Gulf's ticking time bomb

The clock is running down on an ecological disaster in of oil off the coast of Tauranga. the Hauraki Gulf as an unknown amount of oil sits in the sunken RMS Niagara.

The Royal Mail Ship (RMS) Niagara was sunk in 1940 by a mine and now sits in the Hauraki Gulf Marine Park, about 30 kilometres offshore.

At the Hauraki Gulf Forum meeting earlier this year, executive officer Alex Rogers said the wreck, like many sunken World World II ships, was hitting its "peak leak period".

"Ruptures will occur as a natural result of the impact of corrosion and pressure on the wreck," Rogers said.

"In the worst case scenario, the wreck may hold up to a further 1600 tonnes of heavy fuel oil – though not all

of that would go at once."

Rogers compared the amount of oil in the RMS Niagara to the 2011 Rena wreck that discharged around 300 tonnes

The Environment Minister at the time of the Rena wreck, Nick Smith, called it the worst maritime environmental disaster.

Rogers said ministers had sought funding for further investigation into the RMS Niagara's fuel holdings.

"In 2018, Maritime New Zealand advised government they needed funding to investigate the wreck – ministers sought funding but were turned down at cabinet."

He said it was "unconscionable that we would let it keep ticking."

Auckland Transport raises its road death target

"Regional land transport plan road safety funding has been reduced substantially – \$30 million from \$74 million so there are these big changes there."

She said legislative changes around road safety had not materialised which also added to the issue.

Some councillors said they could not support an increase in the target.
