# Residents' views sought on plans for Clevedon's public spaces



A draft plan is out for consultation which re-imagines Clevedon's public spaces, including the hall and playground.

Auckland Council is asking people to have their say about Clevedon's public spaces.

Consulting business Isthmus has prepared draft concept plans which propose changes to four of Clevedon's public spaces:

- Clevedon Community Hall and playground space
- Clevedon District Centre
- Clevedon Village Reserve
- Clevedon Showgrounds

INSIDE:

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The plans build on previous work done by the Clevedon Community and Business Association, with the intention that they can be used by Franklin Local Board to make informed decisions for future funding and delivery of public space upgrades.

With Clevedon's population set to double over the next few years, the plans aim to make better use of public spaces and cater for the increase in residents.

The draft plan suggests the following changes to public spaces within the village:

- expanding the playground with a mixture of natureinspired play elements and rural-themed structures
- building a bike hub, and new public toilets/showers
- removing the existing car park beside the hall and creating a new multi-use carpark (which could also be used as an events area) west of the playground

- creating space beside the hall for an events area
- creating a large foyer towards Papakura-Clevedon Road to extend the community hall
- opening up the northern side of the hall building to create a deck area
- replacing the current library with a mobile library to create more space for parking
- moving Clevedon Plunket Clinic to the District Centre site, to accommodate consultation rooms and other community services
- establishing a civic garden at the District Centre site
- keeping Clevedon Village Reserve as a green space, installing signage and improving public seating.

Isthmus has consulted with Clevedon Showgrounds user groups, and identified some inefficiencies in the way the grounds are currently used. It proposes redesigning the site into three separate spaces which cater for sports clubs, recreation/special events and equestrian facilities.

Proposed plans for the showgrounds include:

• improving the efficiency of the sports field layout, allowing clubs to grow their number of fields above and beyond their requested growth levels.

# Editorial by Hūnua, Ararimu and Paparimu Valley Residents Association

# Hūnua Ararimu Paparimu Residents Association (HAPVRA) gets cracking

Autumn may be the season of mists and mellow fruitfulness, according to English poet John Keats but for Hūnua Ararimu Paparimu Valley Residents Association members, it's the best time to start tackling crack willows infesting the Wairoa River.

An inaugural community event to eradicate and raise awareness about crack willows was (at time of printing) held on ANZAC Day afternoon in Paparimu. Water-soluble herbicide capsules were drilled into more than a dozen trees on a property in Moumoukai Rd, below the Wairoa Dam. Crack willows are on Auckland Council's pest plant list and HAPVRA's goal is to remove and replace them with riparian planting. With fewer branches and tree roots blocking the river, there will be reduced flooding.

HAPVRA's Geraldine Schnauer says the initiative is in response to Cyclone Gabrielle, which caused widespread damage as well as a desire to act as guardians of the environment, which includes the Hūnua Ranges: "The Wairoa River is special to many people, including Māori and we want to look after it, and in turn it will look after us.

We are looking at ways to preserve our local environment, which includes

helping to protect the Wairoa River and Hūnua Ranges. Raising awareness about the importance of eradicating crack willows and replacing them with native plants is part of this holistic approach."

HAPVRA's Chris Way says getting rid of crack willows isn't easy: "We've been told the willows will die within two to three months of being injected and will then gently decay over coming months and years. But getting to them can be difficult, as some riverbanks are steep and covered in weeds. We need to clear tributaries that feed into the river too."

HAPVRA is one of several community groups applying for funding to assist with improving the health of the Wairoa River: "One thing that doesn't need to be done is to clear dead willows, once the herbicide has taken effect," says Friends of Te Wairoa chair Glenn Richards. "The trees will gently decay over many months and become light and brittle, so any fallen branches won't be a problem for fences or cause further blockages in waterways. It will be interesting to note over coming months, if temperatures and seasons affect the effectiveness of the herbicide. We are mapping the results, so we can keep track of progress and share the learnings with the community."

HAPVRA recently received funding from Auckland Council for emergency response planning and education. A portion of this was set aside to do some drone mapping of the river, to illustrate the scale of the crack willow infestation.

"The Hūnua Ranges are a taonga. We are lucky to live in this beautiful part of the world," says Geraldine. "Going forward we want to involve iwi and different community groups, such as schools as well as older residents in some of our educational and cultural plans to celebrate and protect our regional park and the people who live in and around it for years to come."

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


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# Lawyer's first novel draws inspiration from Hemingway

Around the globe, people continue to be fascinated by the life and works of Ernest Hemingway. Now aspects of the infamous author's life have been revived in a debut novel written by Maraetai local, Dermot Ross.

In *Hemingway's Goblet*, Dermot shines a sometimes-unflattering light on Hemingway in a story that is set in contemporary times.

The book's central character is Nick Harrieson, whose life takes an unexpected turn when he is accused of sexually harassing one of his female students. While awaiting the hearing of his case he decides to investigate some family history regarding his grandfather, Ernest Hemingway.

Some of Nick's discoveries are heartbreaking and some are astounding. These include his grandfather's terrible death as a prisoner of war, and his links to Ernest Hemingway which show the famous literary icon in a new light.

Through his research, Nick also embarks on a personal journey of love, selfexploration, and honesty. Life will never be the same for him once the truth comes out.

Dermot Ross has spent about five years working on the novel, and has left few stones unturned in his research about Hemingway.

"Being so well-known and a larger-thanlife figure, I started researching him, and read several articles and biographies, and thought about tying a fictional character into Hemingway's own fictional character, Harris, in The Sun Also Rises."

"My Hemingway research has taken me in all sorts of directions. I have about 50 books, which I describe as my Hemingway collection, consisting of his works, biographies and criticisms of him, and I am a member of a number of popular Hemingway Facebook sites."

Dermot took his research the extra mile, visiting all of the places in Spain featured in his novel (San Sebastian, Burguete, Pamplona and Alicante).

He even attended the Hemingway Society conference in Montana and Wyoming in 2022.

Years spent as a corporate lawyer have bestowed Dermot with solid research and writing skills.

"Like many lawyers I have spent the whole of my career writing documents and letters, and so it is a natural stretch to think that one can write a book, fiction or nonfiction. About five years ago I decided it would be good fun to write a novel."

Hemingway's Goblet showcases Dermot's knowledge and passion for the law, military history, Spain, and, of course, the life and works of Ernest Hemingway. It also examines modern relationships in the #meetoo era.



- improving drainage and lighting in the areas which the sports groups have requested
- improving informal recreation for Clevedon's youth through the creation of a Youth Activity Hub with a large pump track, BBQ picnic area, and basketball
- court and hangout spaces
- expanding the number of indoor and outdoor tennis courts, as well as creating an indoor tennis club
- creating a covered equestrian arena and additional stables to provide national grade equestrian facilities.
- shifting existing Clevedon Pony Club facilities to the south-eastern corner of the grounds
- providing additional entrance points to the grounds, and removing vehicle movement from central areas so they can be used for special events
- adding a new covered Showgrounds events building to accommodate the Farmer's Market and other public and private events

Franklin Local Board already has some funds set aside for the playground and public toilets renewal on the Community Hall site, but the rest of the proposed upgrades identified are just plans, with no budget currently assigned.

# Plan Change 88: what will it mean for your morning commute?

An independent hearing panel's recent Jack Lachlan Drive intersection decision to approve Plan Change 88, which will see the redevelopment of 307 hectares south of Beachlands, has many locals wondering what the impact will be on local roads.

Traffic and roading were a major source of disagreement at last year's Plan Change 88 hearing. A third of submitters raised concerns about transport, and there was disagreement between experts on both sides about what measures should be taken if the Plan Change was approved.

Council's transport expert argued that substantial additional transport infrastructure would be required, saying "Otherwise there will be significant adverse effects on the safe and efficient operation of the transport network".

After assessing the evidence, the commissioners decided that widening the road, installing safety barriers or creating a four-lane road were not necessary because: "There has been an improvement in the safety record of the road network due to the speed limit being reduced," and "Additional traffic flows are likely to have the result of slowing speed on the road network, including particularly at the main point of concern (Mangemangeroa Bridge)".

The commissioners noted submitters' concerns about the 'one way in, one way out' nature of Whitford-Maraetai Road, but said the alternate route through Clevedon was a positive factor.

The commissioners did not believe that increased traffic flows through Whitford would significantly change the nature of Whitford village, saying that the proposed upgrade to a two-lane roundabout would "not appreciably worsen that situation and in fact would improve safety for pedestrians."

With respect to emissions, the commissioners again accepted BSLP's evidence, concluding: "We agree with the Applicant's expression that elements to reduce greenhouse gas emissions have been 'baked in' to the design and reflected in the provisions for PC 88. We find that PC 88 supports reductions in GHG emissions."

During the hearings process, BSLP amended its precinct plans in reponse to Council's Hearing Report and submitters' concerns.

"This included changes and upgrades to identify additional upgrades including the intersection of Somerville Road / Whitford Road / Point View Road and the Whitford bypass which also benefited the wider area," says Russell Property Group managing director Brett Russell, whose company is managing the project on behalf of BSLP.

The commissioners concluded that the following staged approach to road upgrades proposed by BSLP was acceptable:

### a) Up to a maximum of 250 dwellings and/or residential lots

- upgrade of Jack Lachlan Drive to provide two-way cycling facilities along the full length of one side of the road; and a footpath on the northern side of the road.
- upgrade of Whitford Maraetai Road /

- upgrade of Whitford Park Road / Whitford Road / Whitford Maraetai Road roundabout to a double lane roundabout
- upgrade of Somerville Road / Whitford Road / Point View Drive roundabout to provide a double north-west bound through-lane for additional capacity

# b) More than 250 and up to 500 dwellings or residential lots

- upgrades in (a) above
- provision for a total capacity of at least 592 ferry passengers from Pine Harbour during the two-hour peak period between 0630-0830 on weekdays.

# c) More than 500 and up to 850 dwellings or residential lots;

- upgrades in (a) and (b) above
- provision for a total capacity of at least 692 ferry passengers from Pine Harbour Ferry during the two-hour peak period between 0630-0830 on weekdays
- provision of an additional left-turn approach lane on the northbound approach to the Whitford Park Road / Saleyard Road / Sandstone Road roundabout

### d) More than 850 and up to 1,900 dwellings or residential lots

- upgrades in (a) (c) above
- provision for a total capacity of at least 952 ferry passengers from Pine Harbour during the two-hour peak period between 0630-0830 on weekdays
- upgrade to Trig Road / Whitford-Maraetai Road intersection

# e) More than 1,900 and up to 2,700 dwellings or residential lots

- upgrades in (a) (d) above
- provision for a total capacity of at least 1224 ferry passengers from Pine Harbour during the two-hour peak period between 0630-0830 on weekdays
- Whitford Bypass\* providing a two-way single lane each way between the Trig Road / Whitford- Maraetai Road intersection and the Saleyard Road / Whitford Park Road / Sandstone Road intersection, including upgrades to the intersections at both ends. If the Whitford Bypass is brought forward in timing prior to the Whitford Park Road / Whitford Road / Whitford Maraetai Road roundabout then this roundabout upgrade is not required.

# Who will pay?

BSLP proposes that funding for transport infrastructure upgrades (including ferry upgrades and operation, and transport infrastructure) will come via the Infrastructure Funding and Financing (IFF) Act, which enables developments to raise finance which is repaid by levies charged to local households.

Brett Russell says the proposed development will feature increased business and commercial activity, "to support more jobs within the area, as well as new schools, reducing the need for Beachlands residents to travel as far for work or schooling. offering more jobs and schooling locally."

\* The Whitford Bypass is a project which has been on Council plans for twenty years. It is currently a 'paper road', but when developed will divert traffic south of Whitford Village along Saleyard Road.

Pet obesity may not always be the primary reason animals visit our clinics, but it's a common topic in our discussions with pet owners. While you may not notice your pet slowly gaining weight, because we see your pets more infrequently (as well as often having a record of their weight from previous visits) we are often better placed to pick up on subtle changes. SPCA studies reveal alarming statistics: over 25% of dogs and 20% of cats in New Zealand are overweight or obese.

- · Decreased Immune Function: Obesity can weaken the immune system, making pets more susceptible to infections.

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
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# Half-price public transport youth fares reach the end of the line

public transport for children aged 5-12 and half price public transport fares for people under the age of 26.

The Government has axed its support of the subsidised fares, and Auckland Transport says it is unable to continue the free and half price travel for young people, however it does offer concessions for tertiary and secondary school students.

The move raises the cost of weekday bus, train and ferry fares for youth, with secondary school and university students

The end of April signals the end of free likely to be most impacted amid ongoing cost of living pressure.

### Children ages 5-15

Children ages 5 to 12 will no longer travel for free on weekdays and will pay child fares (at least 40% off adult fares) from 1 May. Half-price child fares for children ages 13 to 15 will end.

Council-funded free weekend fares for AT HOP card holders under-16s will remain in place.

### **Secondary school students**

Half-price secondary fares for students

ages 13 to 15 will end. Students ages 16 off adult fares. If you apply for a tertiary to 19 with a secondary concession on a registered AT HOP card will be eligible for a reduced fare (at least 40% off adult birthday, whichever comes first.

### **Youth 16 to 24**

Half-price fares for youth ages 16 to 24 will end. Community Services card, Total Mobility card or Blind Low Vision NZ card holders can apply to receive concessions of at least 40% off fares.

Full-time tertiary students can apply for a tertiary concession to get at least 20%

COMING SOON TO

concession before 1 May and you're under 25, it will activate on 1 May or your 25th

The cost increases mean that for a full time tertiary student holding an AT HOP card, the cost of catching the Pine Harbour Ferry into Auckland doubles from \$5.90 per one way trip to \$11.80 (or \$9.30 if they have successfully applied for a tertiary concession).


In between our music playlist we tell jokes, we give shout outs to children who are dancing to our music outside our studio and on our programme script we have a variety of DJ chat topics which are really





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
